

Ithough IOI 2022 were dominated by the amount of male participants, every female participant did not falter behind and had shown a tough, extraordinary spirit as well.

This was shown in yesterday's excursion - where contestants went to Indonesian Institute of Art (ISI) for various art workshops, while their team leaders went to Keraton Yogyakarta and Taman Sari Water Palace.

Flavia Pisani, the Team Leader of Brazil had shown her proactive spirit throughout the entire series of IOI 2022. "Yogyakarta Palace was very interesting, we went around to see the history of the Sultan (king) and his family! Also, the local residents here are very friendly. One thing I really like about Yogyakarta is the traffic (ambience), which brings serenity, pleasure, and beauty. While staying here, we met many women from the organizer team. They are very friendly and they love to help us! Moreover, the women in Yogyakarta Palace use Bahasa Indonesia politely and gracefully," said Pisani.

"At the opening ceremony, I was surprised to find out there were lots of male contestants. Even the team leaders are dominated by male. But this can be very interesting! These women can inspire many people because they are also tech warriors. One of them comes from Team Brazil. So I think we should bring women to fight in this competition," Pisani concluded.

Culture, Research, and Technology, Suharti, indicated about the increase of female students who joined IT competition. She had also revealed that the ministry wants to push an increase of female participants through various IT and science competitions.

"The ministry strives to encourage female students to like science and informatics disciplines. So it has an impact on the increase of female students in an olympiad contest," said Suharti on Tuesday 9th August.



Ayushi Mahajan, a female contestant from Ireland shared her excitement for Indonesian Batik. She had participated in the 33rd IOI 2021 in Singapore. "We made some kind of pattern on the fabric, blending blue and purple. This has been very interesting!," said Mahajan with a bright smile after attending the Batik workshop.

She also shared her thoughts related to domination of male in the world of informatics.

"In Ireland, when it comes to this field, women are treated fairly, so I'm sure I can do what men can do," she concluded, as she hopes that Ireland team would at least get an Honorable Mention.

According to Fuadi, the ITC team had found several issues during the contest such as reports on the internet connection trouble, among others. ITC team responded swiftly to tackle these obstacles and resolved incoming issues.

"Overall, there are no major obstacles and the contest continued to run smoothly as scheduled," Fuadi concluded.■

These two historical places in Yogyakarta are perfect for your Instagram!


Taman Sari
